From the East

Our Illustrious Worshipful Brother George Washington was born February 22nd, 1732. He was initiated on November 4th, 1752, passed to the degree of Fellowcraft March 3rd, and raised to the sublime degree of Master Mason August 4th, 1753. In 1788, our Illustrious Brother became the first Worshipful Master of Alexandria Lodge No. 22. On January 6, 1759, George Washington married Martha Dandridge Custis. The newlywed couple moved to their beloved Mount Vernon Estate.

In February 1960 a group of dedicated Masons met to begin the task of establishing a new lodge on the original land tract owned by WB George Washington. The name selected for the new lodge was Mount Vernon Lodge. The name was selected due to the significant ties of Mount Vernon to our departed Illustrious Worshipful Brother General George Washington.

Over the past several months a group of officers of Mount Vernon Lodge began discussing the need for a long-range strategy to ensure the Lodge remains strong and vibrant well in to the future, and continues to honor our heritage and tie to Mount Vernon and our Illustrious Worshipful Brother. The charter members of our Lodge wished to honor George Washington and his Masonic history by establishing the only Masonic Lodge located on the original land tract of the Mount Vernon Estate. We also looked to the Mission and Vision statements of the Grand Lodge to formulate our own Lodge Mission and Vision statements. These statements will instruct the long-range strategic planning committee as we begin to develop specific plans on our future, to include efforts to upgrade and renovate our grounds and facilities. Masonic Education

Have you ever wondered the origins or meaning of the phrase "on the square?" When a stonemason cuts a block to use in the construction of a building, it must be perfectly shaped so it will support the other blocks that surround it. The block's sides must be perfectly straight with no faults, so it will do its part as just one small piece of a much larger building. To check the reliability of his workmanship, the stonemason uses a tool shaped like a right angle to determine whether the sides and angles of the stone are perfect. Freemasons use the term "on the square" to describe their trust in each other. A man who is "on the square" is honest and reliable, and is a strong part of the whole community around him. It follows that this term is also used to mean "just between you and me." When one Mason tells another something he'd like to be kept private, he'll often say "this is on the square."

Have you as a Master Mason ever heard the phrase "I see you are a traveling man?" Well, our Brother Charlie Cleveland has started a journey where he will definitely be able to say 'Yes, I am!' On January 11th Brother Charlie and his wife Mary Ann onboard their vessel Anne Marie Rose got underway from Solomons, MD to complete the "Big Loop." This trip will take them up the east coast, across the Great Lakes, down the Mississippi, around the coast of Florida, and back to their starting point. Díd You Know?

Brother Omar Bradley was born on February 12th, 1893. General of the Army Omar Nelson Bradley was a highly distinguished senior officer of the United States Army during and after World War II. Brother Bradley was the first Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff and oversaw the U.S. military's policy-making in the Korean War. Brother Bradley graduated from West Point. While at the academy, Brother Bradley's devotion to sports prevented him from excelling academically, although he was 44th in a class of 164. He was a baseball star and often played on semi-pro teams for no remuneration (to ensure his eligibility to represent the academy). He was considered one of the most outstanding college players in the nation during his junior and senior seasons at West Point, noted as both a power hitter and an outfielder with one of the best arms in his day. He rejected multiple offers to play professional baseball, choosing to pursue his Army career. While stationed at West Point as an instructor in 1923, Brother Bradley became a Master Mason and member in good standing of West Point Lodge #877, Highland Falls, New York until his death in 1981.
